Since that time, we have raised nearly \$4M for sarcoma research, making us one of the most successful grassroots sarcoma foundations in the United States. Although Paula succumbed to the disease in 2014, we passionately continue her mission to broaden the global research landscape and expand the idea of worldwide hope for all sarcoma patients, by investing locally in novel treatment options and research excellence.
